What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Montréal

- Arrive in Montréal and meet your Tour Director.
- Take a walking tour of Old Montréal: Old Port;
 Jacques-Cartier Square; Underground
 City; Chinatown.
- Participate in an evening activity.

Day 2: Montréal

- Take a guided tour of Montréal: Mount Royal Park; City Hall; Montréal Harbour; McGill University; Place des Arts; Place Ville Marie.
- Visit Notre-Dame Basilica.
- Visit the Archaeology Museum.
- Bike tour of Montréal (available Apr-Oct)
 Winter Activity on Mount Royal (available Nov-Mar)
- Enjoy a Old Montréal dinner experience.
- Participate in an evening activity.

Day 3: Montréal | Québec City

- Visit the Olympic Tower funicular.
- Travel to Québec City. Your Tour Director will lead you on a walk of the cliffs of Cap Diamant, first settled by French explorer Jacques Cartier. The cliffs are named for the iron pyrite and quartz crystals present at the site, which were originally mistaken for gold and precious stones, thus the name "Cape Diamond." See the Citadelle, a fortress that dates back to 1820. Still garrisoned today, the fort is built in the shape of a four-pointed polygon in the historic neighbourhood of Québec City, which became a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985. Then walk along the Promenade des Gouverneurs, a scenic walkway just below the Citadelle that provides wonderful views of the city and the St. Lawrence River.
- Visit the Observatoire de la Capitale.
- Take a guided tour of Québec City: Streets of the Old City; Quartier Petit Champlain; Château Frontenac; Place Royale; National Assembly; Grande Allée; Upper Town.
- Visit Olympic Park, and take a guided tour.

Optionals and excursions

Day 4: Québec City

- Participate in a historical interpretation and re-enactment at the Plains of Abraham.
- Take a walking tour of Québec City: Cap Diamant; Citadelle; Dufferin Terrace; Promenade des Gouverneurs.
- Visit a museum in Old Québec.
- Enjoy dinner at a traditional sugar shack.

Day 5: Beaupré | Québec City

- Take a tour of the Beaupré Coast.
- Visit Montmorency Falls.
- Visit an economuseum on the Beaupré Coast.
- Visit Ste-Anne-de-Beaupré Basilica.
- Return to Québec City.
- Participate in an evening activity.
