VE Day 75: Amsterdam, Normandy & Paris

May 2, 2020 – May 10, 2020

There can never be just one side, or one story, in war. This tour will help you look through all of the different lenses of the Second World War by approaching cities and sites from the perspectives of the Allies, civilians, the resistance, and the Axis. Sometimes it's hard to understand the difficult decisions people were forced to make during wartime, but realizing the context in which they made them will give you a clearer comprehension of the Second World War, and Canada's place in the world.

Victory in Europe

May 5, 1945—Nazi forces finally surrender, and Canadian and Allied troops liberate the Netherlands after months of battling to push out the Nazis.

More than seven decades later, the connection forged between Canadians and the Dutch has stayed strong. In May 2020, students and cadets can experience firsthand present-day Dutch culture, and discover for themselves how the unique histories and contributions of the Allied forces continue to influence modern European life and our world today.

What you'll experience on your tour

May 2, 2020 – May 10, 2020

Day 1: Fly to Amsterdam

Board your overnight flight to Amsterdam.

Day 2: Arrive in Amsterdam

Touch down in Amsterdam, a city where 1,200 bridges crisscross 160 canals to make it one of Europe's most charming capitals. Enjoy a walking tour of the city where you'll see the *Westerkerk* (West Church), where Rembrandt is buried. You'll also visit Dam Square, which is home to *Koninklijk Paleis* (the Royal Palace), before seeing the Flower Market and Jewish Quarter. Then, visit the Anne Frank House, where the young girl hid with her family from 1942 to 1944. This is also the site where she penned her poignant diary, which has been translated into dozens of languages worldwide. The Anne Frank House is subject to availability due to capacity issues. If the site can't be visited, a replacement walking tour will be offered.

Day 3: Amsterdam

Every May 4, the entire nation of Amsterdam participates in a two-minute moment of silence for Remembrance Day. [At the VE Day remembrance ceremony at the Groesbeek Canadian War Cemetery, join fellow Canadians and the local community in memorializing those who fell during the Second World War.](#)

Day 4: Wageningen | Amsterdam

Travel to Wageningen, a historic town along the Rhine river. Here, you'll commemorate Liberation Day—when the Dutch celebrate the end of Nazi occupation and honour freedom, democracy, and human rights. [While you're here, you'll be participating in EF-enhanced events surrounding the celebrations.](#)

Day 5: Bastogne region

In Belgium, Bastogne was occupied by German forces in 1944 and was a key site during the Battle of the Bulge—the last major German offensive campaign on the Western Front. [At the Bastogne War Museum, you'll participate in a workshop that will highlight civilian and military experiences during the Second World War,](#) and get an in-depth look at the Battle of the Bulge through theatrical audiovisuals and memorabilia. From there, you'll visit one of the key sites of the battle, Bois-Jacques.

Day 6: Normandy

Travel to Normandy.

Day 7: Normandy | Paris

On June 6, 1944, Allied troops landed on the beaches of Normandy, launching the campaign that eventually liberated mainland Europe from the Nazis. [At the Juno Beach Centre, take part in immersive activities and unique experiences exclusive to EF travellers.](#) Programming will encourage exploration of Juno Park and give travellers a more in-depth understanding of the site's history. Pay your respects at the Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery. Afterwards, you're on your way to Paris.

Day 8: Paris

Paris was taken by German soldiers in 1940, and its people lived under the Nazi regime until the French uprising and liberation in 1944. Today, Paris is known as the City of Light—a fashion, art, and culinary capital of the world. Get to know Parisian history, from the Louvre to the *École Militaire*, during an expertly guided tour. Enjoy more self-guided exploration of Paris, or [visit Versailles.](#)

Day 9: Depart for home

Say goodbye to your Tour Director at the airport and depart for home.
